### **CWW RESOLUTION 2015-102** **SUPPORT IMPLEMENTATION OF INTERIM TEXT TO 911**

June 12, 2015

**WHEREAS**, The Conference of Western Wayne (CWW), a consortium of eighteen Western Wayne communities in Wayne County who serve a total population of 700,000 residents, has joined in an effort to improve local government and enhance the quality of life for area residents through municipal cooperation; and

**WHEREAS**, the U.S. population is approximately 313 million and there are an estimated 330 million connected wireless devices in the U.S.; and

**WHEREAS**, there have been exponential increases in the use of text messaging. More than 8 trillion texts were sent in 2014, a 1.1 trillion increase from 2013; and

**WHEREAS**, 34 million Americans who are deaf or hard of hearing rely on text messaging to communicate, and Text to 911 would be the first equal access to 911 for the deaf and hard of hearing community; and

**WHEREAS**, Text to 911 can provide assistance in emergency situations where a voice call may be detrimental to the caller's safety; and

**WHEREAS**, the 12 CWW PSAPs can utilize the GEM software solution at no cost to the individual PSAP. The GEM solution will allow the CWW PSAPs to transfer Text to 911 calls within the CWW region, as well as with Oakland County; and

**WHEREAS**, each PSAP will be required to have a computer and public IP address. The CWW will financially assist those PSAPs who are not currently equipped with a computer or public IP address; and

**WHEREAS**, the CWW will work with the PSAPs, police departments, wireless providers, and a consultant to do multiple test texts in all necessary areas; and

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Conference of Western Wayne offers this resolution in support of the implementation of the interim solution for Text to 911 via the GEM software solution.
